The MLA Certificate Program

- A partnership between Midcoast Leadership Academy and UMaine Hutchinson Center

MLA brings together emerging and established leaders -- sharpening current skills, developing new ones, broadening understanding of pertinent community issues, building networks, and forming the relationships necessary to sustain a strong community leadership base.

Each program year, a group of 20-25 individuals is thoughtfully selected from Knox and Waldo Counties through an application and selection process which aims to provide diversity of thought, knowledge, and experience.

MLA Staff and Faculty

Our program is lead by its graduates, accessing our growing network of alumni from throughout Midcoast Maine.

Our distinguished guest speakers are drawn from the worlds of academia, business, government, consulting, and the non-profit sector.

Program Days

Program days focus on experiential learning and discussions of issues that are pertinent to the cultural, social and economic climate of our region. Sessions are led by experts in each topic area, employing action-oriented group activities, including issue-based experiential learning. Case studies and field trips are among the tools participants will use in pursuit of regional leadership.

Monthly program days are generally scheduled from 8am to 4pm. September to June Sessions are held at various locations throughout Knox and Waldo counties during the year.

We realize that occasional unavoidable conflicts will arise, but graduation is dependent on near perfect attendance.
